Thank you for your pre-registration as proctor at University of New Brunswick. You will receive email communication once a team selects you as their proctor.

Your involvement as proctor is extremely important. The primary goal is to make sure the students are having fun. Additional responsibilities are outlined below: however, we recommend that you also ensure the students are comfortable, getting adequate rest, and are eating, drinking and exercising during the 24-hour competition.

Proctor tasks include:

- Monitor the general flow of the activity
- Inform students when the competition begins, when they have reached the halfway mark, when there are 6 hours left, and when there is 1 hour left
- Ensure that no one external to the team members helps or assists the participants in resolving the problems in any way
- Ensure that participants do not engage in plagiarism and adhere to the IEEE Code of Conduct
